In the first part of last month, we were busy preparing ourselves to welcome refugees who were supposed to fly to Kansas City from different parts of the world. Their travels were booked and confirmed, and we met with their jubilant family member(s) who could not wait to hold them in their arms. We were thrilled to see the smiling faces of those who waited for their loved ones to join them. Arrangements were made to welcome the new refugees so they don't walk out of the airport alone. But the executive orders from the president changed everything suddenly, and every smile turned into tears. The refugees, their US families, and my staff are devastated by the suspension of the refugee resettlement program. An upbeat refugee who was waiting for his wife to join him on January 23rd lost all hope! We cried with him as none of us knew when the refugee resettlement program would resume.

Apart from the refugee program, all the other programs are in full swing. The sewing class has started with 14 new students. They are poised to unlock their full potential, embracing new skills in a space they lovingly describe as a haven of happiness and inclusivity, where everyone feels valued and supported. The after-school program students have come back, and our students are happy to see their friends and the Bethel staff. Our high school students look forward to visiting Judson University in Elgin, IL to have a first-hand experience on a college campus from February 15-17 to learn about college, attend classes, and sleep in the students' dormitory. We are thankful to the pastors of Area 5 of the Great Rivers Region for inviting our students to join the trip.
